Ingrid Tauber and Alfred Tauber established The Laszlo N. Tauber Foundation in memory of their father, Laszlo N. Tauber, after his death in 2002. Through the establishment of the Foundation, Ingrid and Fred seek to continue the philanthropic activity in which their father had engaged for many years, including his strong commitment to Jewish welfare. The

Israeli office was established in 2007 in order to strengthen the Foundation's activities in Israel.

Priorities of the Foundation in Israel

The activity of the office in Israel focuses on the advancement of the rehabilitation of people with psychiatric disabilities and their integration into the community. The objective that the Foundation has set for itself is to contribute to creating a systemic change in the area of psychiatric rehabilitation. In order to advance this objective, the Foundation operates by developing cooperative programs with key institutions committed to these objectives, which include the Government of Israel, non-governmental agencies, and other philanthropic foundations.

The Foundation invests in the professionalization of psychiatric rehabilitation through designated academic programs, service development and advocacy. The first service developed by the Foundation is the Psychiatric Rehabilitation Case Management Service. The Foundation also established ISPRA – The Israel Psychiatric Rehabilitation Service.

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
